MESSAGE FROM THE FOUNDER AND PRESIDENT, JEFF SALTER

On April 1st, 2021, to celebrate 30 years of serving seniors, I decided to tour the country on an electric bike to visit all the Caring locations and to raise awareness of senior care needs in America.

My bike was more than transportation; it was a symbol of assistance, which allows us all to achieve things that we didn't think were possible. For example, seniors can live happy, healthy, and fulfilled lives, but they might need a little assistance at times.

Along the way, I raised nearly \$170,000 in support of this cause and used these funds as seed money to start Close the Gap in Senior Care, an independent, nonprofit organization. The name is significant because in cycling, "closing the gap" between riders is crucial for top performance, allowing cyclists to get farther and faster as a team. Likewise, when caregivers, community leaders, innovators, and entrepreneurs work together, we can "Close the Gap" in meeting the needs of America's seniors.

October 20, 2023, will be the second anniversary of Close the Gap in Senior Care.

FEATURED INITIATIVE: GRAB THE BARS



One of the biggest gaps in senior care is fall prevention. Every 11 seconds, a senior is treated in the emergency room for a fall. And the cost of their treatment averages \$30,000. But many of these falls could be prevented with grab bars—saving money, dignity, and even lives of seniors across the country.

Falls are the leading cause of fatal injury among seniors, and over 80% of those falls happen in the bathroom. But there is a simple and cost-effective solution that can help significantly reduce a senior's risk of falling: grab bars. These safety devices can be easily installed in any bathroom to provide support and stability, reducing the likelihood of falls and serious injuries.

Our maiden initiative, "Grab the Bars," focused on fall prevention through these safety devices. Using a nomination process, we provided grab bars for seniors who may not otherwise have the means or ability to install them.

In March 2022, we began accepting nominations for grab bar installations, and so far, we have received 578 nominations from across the United States. Over 470 nominations have been approved and sent to our installer networks: Lowe's Livable Home and TruBlue Home Service Ally. In June 2022, we opened nominations to another key partner, Veterans Care Coordination and have helped over 90 veterans and veteran spouses.

Over the past 16 months, we have completed and paid for 318 installations, ensuring those seniors have one more way to age in place safely.


